Roger Skinner 1942 - 2015

As you wiill all be aware by now, Roger Skinner sadly passed away quietly in hospital on Monday 10th August after a short illness, surrounded by Mary and his family. His funeral was held in the Amersham Crematorium on 25th August, and as you would expect of such a popular chap, there was standing room only at the very moving service, and our club was well represented. It is clear from the eulogies that he had crammed so much into his life - he leaves a huge gap in the lives of many, including those in our club, that will be very difficult indeed to fill. On behalf of the club, Clive Wayland gave an address at the wake at Ellesborough Golf Club and proposed a toast to Roger's memory – Clive's words sum up all of our feelings, I'm sure, so I can do no better than to repeat them here:

"Mary has asked me to thank you all for coming, it means a great deal and is a testimony to how loved Roger was. I am here to speak on behalf of Aylesbury MG Club. Roger was our friend. He was passionate about the Aylesbury MG club, and devoted many many hours over many years to serving on the committee and as Chairman, holding the reins, directing the club, organising events and lots more too. Even right up till he went into hospital he was helping organise yet another weekend away for the benefit of club members. His experience and wisdom benefitted us greatly, and his dry humour, always with the twinkle in his eye, often made us laugh and sometimes broke into a heavy conversation or debate and alleviated the atmosphere. He was a warm-hearted and generous man, never shy to offer help or advice, whether it was asked for or not, and his efforts were finally recognised and rewarded earlier this year when I had the pleasure and honour at our annual dinner of presenting Roger with the 2014 Aylesbury MG Club President's Shield, so richly deserved. Roger, along with Mary,







supported and contributed enormously to our club, helping shape it, overseeing the relocation to The Chequers in Weston Turville and then later helping when we moved to the Lion in Waddesdon, the Crooked Billet in Kingswood and finally back to Waddesdon to the Five Arrows, where we are now. Can you spot the trend there? He loved to get involved in the detail and we were very fortunate to have him in that role, as he often found things we'd missed or forgotten. I think he liked the Arrows too as they do do a nice red! Roger will be sorely missed in so many ways, our club is the poorer without him, we have lost a friend. So, let's raise a glass in his memory - to Roger."


Advertisement: For Sale – 1976 MG Midget 1500
